£3.00 War Gratuity	At that time, the Battalion routine was to spend 4 days in their front line trenches near Kemmel, south west of Ypres, and 4 days resting in billets in the rear of the line. There was very little direct infantry action, however, enemy shelling was a daily occurrence and on 23 <sup>rd</sup> January 1915, the third day of a stint in the trenches, enemy heavy guns pounded the line and rifle fire continued throughout the night.		
paid to Agnes Toomer (mother)	War Diary, Ist Bn Wiltshire Regt, Kemmel, Belgium, Trenches. 23 January 1915 "Heavy shell fire from SE believed to be 6 <sup>°</sup> Howitzers at 12 noon and 4pm. Trenches damaged. Continuous rifle fire on our left throughout the night. 8 killed, 4 wounded".		
One of the 8 men killed that day was Private Henry Sanger; he had been in action less than three weeks.
