1789 Married

A few days since was married, at Semley, in this county, Mr John Marchent, to Miss Elizabeth Crockey, a very agreeable young lady, with a genteel fortune.

1799 Frozen

Mary Brookman, of East Orchard, who left her home on the 27th of Dec. to visit her daughter at Semley, mistaking her road, was found frozen to death in a field about a mile from Shaftesbury.

Whereas

James Bartlett, yearly servant to Mr Thomas Powell, of Semley, Wilts, did on Sunday night last, without any cause or notice to his master, leave his service, and has abandoned in company with one Charles Baker; whoever will give information where the said James Bartlett may be found so as to bring him to justice, to be dealt with according to law, shall receive of the said Thomas Powell a reward of one guinea.

The said James Bartlett is about nineteen years of age, about five feet seven inches high, pale complexion, grey eyes, dark brown hair, well made (goes rather stooping). Any person concealing or employing him after this public notice will be prosecuted according to the statute in that case made and provided.

N.B. Two good labourers wanted immediately in husbandry business, by the above Tho. Powell, by whom good wages will be given, and cottage homes provided. Good characters will be required. Semley, July 24, 1799
