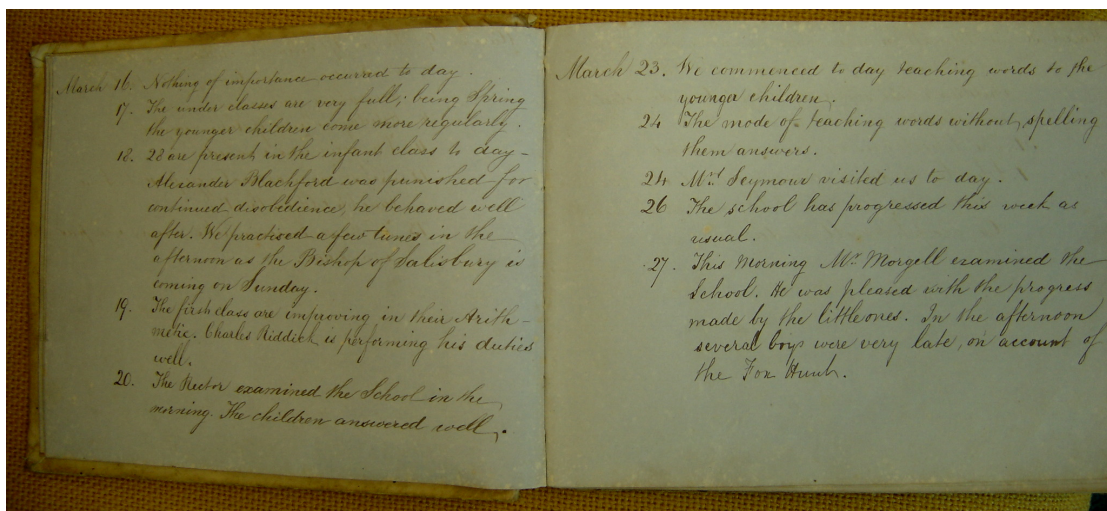
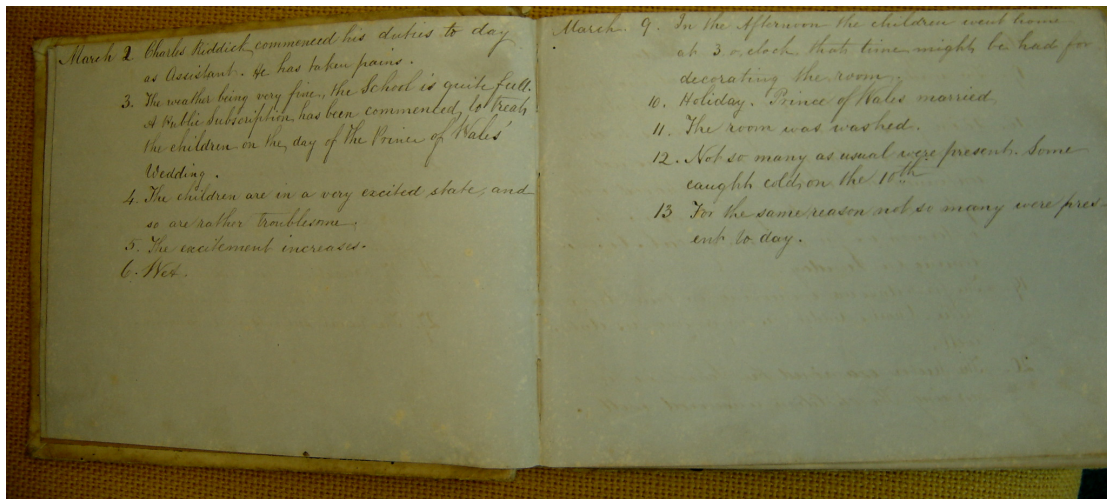
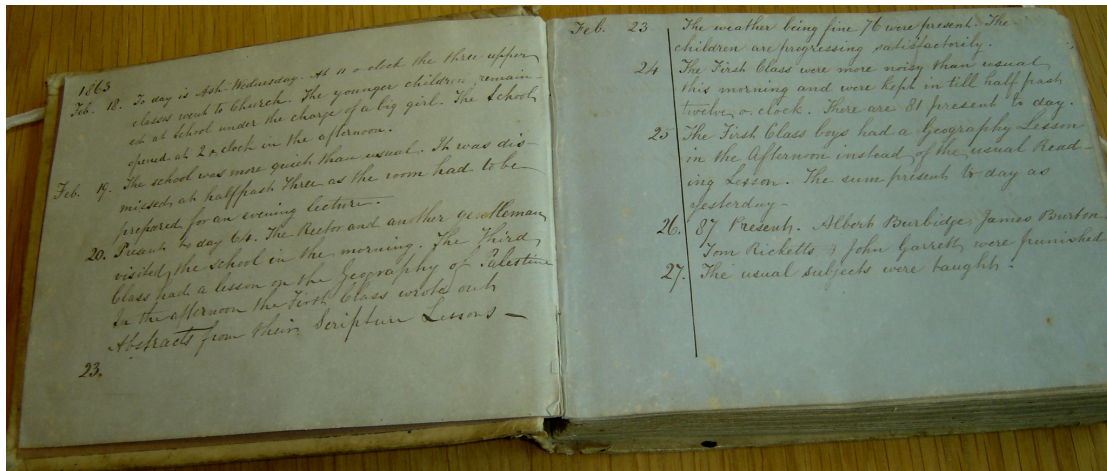


East Knoyle School Log Book
18th February 1863 - 17th July 1863



March 30. Mr. Magell came in this morning. Lambert
Alford commenced. Memorization to day. The
children under six, were obliged to be divided into
two classes.

31. The school goes on much as usual.

April - 1. Charles Riddick gives me good satisfaction.
Present 80. The first class learnt their
Geography well to day.

April 14. Several children were late to day.

15. Only two were late to day. Present 70.
John Burton has left school for work.
The 1st class had a Geography lesson
this afternoon instead of their usual
reading lesson.

16. Lady Rawlinson visited the school.

17. Several of the elder children are away
Robats planting.

18. The school is progressing steadily.

May 4. Twelve boys who had been playing
ice and boards were late this afternoon.

5. The second class is improving in their Irish
make.

6. The Irish and boy mode of teaching reading
to the Fourth class answers admirably.

7. The Irish class are all here this week.
Number present is between 80 & 90.

8. It has been ascertained that the upper classes
do not know good Prayers; they have there-
fore been learning some to day.

May 11. The first class has commenced writing the Prayers.
They seem pleased at the idea of learning them.
82 were present to day.

12. To day is wet, only 52 were present this morning.

13. I have begun teaching the children to sing
their psalter, I think they will get on.
To day is not so wet, but several children
are absent.

14. Holy Thursday. We attended Church in
the morning.

15. Magell Mr. examined the school to day.

May 18. The weather fine, a full school. The two
Irish classes have commenced learning
the Psalms of the Catechism.

19. Very wet. Present between 40 & 50.

20. Same as yesterday.

21. Holiday. Salutory Festival of Parish Choir.

22. The progress of the school is still satis-
factory.

June 1. The Whitsun holidays have not affected
Attendance. Meazle's shilly, prebait, in
the parish.

2. Three first class boys were punished for in-
ness. Lambert Alford, was disobedient.

3. Mr. Magell & Mr. Honey visited the
school this afternoon.

4. The children are learning a new song.
