- 1809 **Claims or Demands**

- 1812 **Attacked**
On Friday night, about nine o'clock, as Mr James, Butcher of Semley, was riding from thence to this city (*Salisbury*), to keep the next day's market. He was knocked off his horse by a blow from an invisible hand (the first intimation he had any person being near him) and when on the ground he was so severely beaten with bludgeons, that it seems to have been the intention of the assailants first to commit murder and then robbery.

Mr James had no time to recover from the stunning blow he first received, so as to observe the assassins, who had made their escape when he was afterwards found senseless on the road, by another traveller, the approach of whom had probably alarmed them, as they had not effected their purpose of robbery. Mr James was conveyed to nearby Cribbage Hut, where he lies in a deplorable state, his nose being split and his face and head dreadfully cut and bruised.

- Not Attacked**
It appears that Mr James of Semley, who was found on the turnpike road much bruised, on Friday evening the 7th inst. had met with no attack from assassins as stated, although we had that statement from Mr James's own son; but being seized with a giddiness of the head (from what cause need not be mentioned), he had fallen from his horse when he was found on the road and conveyed to Cribbage Hut. He has since returned home and is sufficiently recovered of his wounds and bruises to enable him to attend market again, unless the faculty think the giddiness in his head a complaint of so obstinate a nature, as to make it dangerous for him to continue travelling on horseback.

 James Lambert of Motcombe Dorset, labourer, and James Gray of Semley Wilts, labourer, charged with having in the night of the 13th inst. broken into a barn belonging to J Benett Esq in the parish of Tisbury and stolen there from about nine bushels of barley, his property.

 On the 1st inst. died at Semley aged 65 years, after an illness borne with exemplary patience and resignation Mr George Parham, of that place. He was possessed of many estimable qualities; his death will be long regretted by those who knew him.

- Fatal Accident
 On Monday last, as John Harrison, of Hook Farm, Semley, was returning from this city (Salisbury) with an empty wagon belonging to his uncle, Mr King of Britford, the horses took fright and set off at full speed; by some means the unfortunate young man fell and the wheels of the wagon passed over his body, killing him upon the spot.
