This examinant saith on her Oath that she is about 25 years of age and was born in the Parish of Fonthill Bishop aforesaid - as she hath heard and believes, and that her parents were inhabitants legally settled there as she hath also heard and believes - that about the month of October 1830 she hired herself to Mrs. Seymour of Knoyle House in the Parish of East Knoyle in the said County at the wages of 3/6d per week and remained in the said service under that agreement about a quarter of a year and then made a fresh agreement for the wages of £10 per annum with liberty to part on a months notice - that she remained in the said service altogether under both Agreements about a year and a quarter when she left the service on account of illness - that at the time she lived with Mrs. Seymour she was a widow but had no child - that she has done no act to her knowledge or belief to gain a subsequent settlement and that she is now with child.
