Percy Lyulph Wyndham died at Soupir during the Battle of Aisne on 14 September 1914. He has no known grave.



The 3rd Bn Coldstream Guards were part of the original British Expeditionary Force, departing

London on the night of the 11/12 August. A month later on 13 September they were at Chavonne in France, their aim to cross the River Aisne. They eventually crossed by way of a trestle bridge to the northern bank under intense German artillery fire which forced them to retire, 3 men killed and 22 wounded. The next day, 14 September, Lieutenant Percy Lyulph Wyndham was shot in the head at close range while leading his men in savage fighting for the heavily defended La Cour de Soupir Farm to the north Soupir village. The day ended with 66 men killed or wounded. These events were the start of the Battle of the Aisne

Death of Mr Percy Wyndham of Clouds House East Knoyle. The inhabitants of this village were grief-stricken on Wednesday when the news arrived that Lt Percy Wyndham of the Coldstream Guards had died on the battlefield. It was only some two years ago that the deceased gentleman was married to a daughter of Lord Ribblesdale, and a niece of Mrs Asquith, wife of the Prime Minister. Like his father (Rt Hon George Wyndham), and his grandfather (Hon Percy Wyndham), the deceased officer had greatly endeared himself to the parishioners, with all of whom he was on intimate terms.
