The 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion Hampshire Regiment returned to the UK from India in December 1914. In March 1915 they were sent to Gallipoli, evacuated in January 1916 and two months later, as part of 29<sup>th</sup> Division, landed in Marseilles for service in France; they remained there for the rest of the war.

£20 War Gratuity Paid to Edward Brown (father)

2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion Hampshire Regiment took part in the Final Advance in Flanders in 1918. It was during the Advance that Private Brown was wounded and captured at Menin (Belgium) on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 1918. The Capture Report states "bullet left knee front."
