Letter from Lord Arundell of Wardour

June 28th 1824

Gentlemen

The bearer of this - Fowler
of Barker's Hill is the owner of a lifehold

one Toogood a tenant of Semley Parish.
After mature examination Mr Bowles
& I are clearly of opinion the cottage
is the property of Fowler. I am sure
that it cannot be the wish of the Parish
of Semley to deprive or dispute this
man's undoubted right. I therefore
express my hope that the Overseers
will no longer hesitate to put him in
